



OCTOBER MEETING FEEDBACK

THE MEAL

Overall, feedback was very positive, with most guests praising the food—especially the bread pudding and flavorful chicken. A few mentioned favorites like Brussels sprouts and complimented Orr for consistently great meals, though a couple noted this wasn't their favorite and found it a bit bland.

THE VENUE

Overall, attendees loved the beautiful, historic venue and appreciated the spacious layout and character of the space. Some noted challenges with parking, lighting in the overflow lot, and acoustics that made it hard to hear speakers. A few also mentioned an unpleasant odor upon entering.

THE PRESENTATION

Attendees appreciated the purpose and celebration of the meeting, especially recognizing the new board and leadership transitions. However, many felt the meeting was too long and repetitive, suggesting it be shortened or broken up to keep engagement high. Several also mentioned sound issues and recommended improvements to the audio system.
