



THE MEAL

Overall, the food was a big hit, with many guests praising the BBQ, chicken, and desserts as delicious. A few noted minor issues, such as unclear labeling, missing utensils, or not enjoying certain sides, and one person felt the catering staff could have been nicer. Despite these small concerns, most feedback highlighted the meal as very good and enjoyable.

THE VENUE
